








Representing Shapes

Artists use different resources to represent shapes. These include outlines, silhouettes, and inner contours.



Outline it limits a shape. Silhouette it represents a shape using one colour patch. Inner Contour these are the lines colours and textures used inside a shape.

The Relationship Between Shapes and Space

To help us see the distance and depth between shapes, artists use different techniques: overlap, use of cool and warm colors, and sizes of larger and smaller objects. Space is where the shape transforms into a figure.

- A slogan: a simple phrase that makes us think, accompanied by an image to illustrate it.
- Brief text: to explain the message of the poster.
- A logo: to identify the represented organization.
