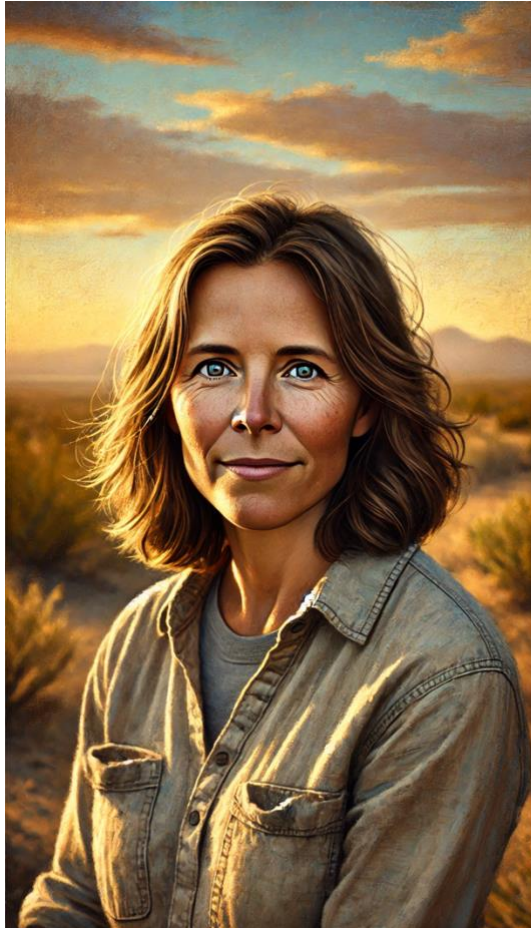


Nancy Holt's Biography
